TREASURER'S REPORT 2008-09

for the period ending September 30th 2009.

I present the East Surrey Association of Cricket Umpires' & Scorers' Association's accounts and report for the twelve-month period ending September 30th 2009.

You will notice that the association made a deficit last year, the first time in its 12-year history. The reason is that we have yet to receive a training grant from the Surrey Cricket Board for last year's courses. We had budgeted for a subsidy of £800 which would more than have offset the deficit of £304. Members' subscriptions show a marked increase from £370 to £500, due to the huge number of people attending our Level 1 course last February, all of whom join the Association as a condition in participating in a course.

Our two courses cost a total of £1096, but this amount now includes the cost of providing a copy of Tom Smith to all participants. Small items of umpires' equipment continue to be sold to members, totalling about £49.

The Annual Dinner broke even, as intended, though a raffle raised over £30. The AGM cost £81 principally the cost of the SNCC pavilion and bar use.

I recommend that the Association's subscriptions remain the same at £5 for the forthcoming year. The Association has sufficient reserves to continue even if we fail to gain the support of SCB for the cost of running our courses in 2009-10, though if a repeated failure turns out to be policy the situation will eventually need to be reviewed.

Finally we continue to express our gratitude to Peter Gale for once again auditing our accounts with such meticulous care.
